## **Vet Tip**



Tip of the month - The eyes have it!

You should check your bunny's eyes every day – any changes should be discussed with your vet: Runny eyes can be a sign of dental problems or something stuck or irritating the eye. Bulging eyes can be a sign of stress, heart disease, fluid build-up, or abscess behind the eye; white bits inside eyes can be a sign of e. cuniculi or another infection. If you notice any changes, contact your local bunny friendly vet and remember - you should never put anything in your bunny's eye without first getting a diagnosis from your vet.
