
Smiles for the Month

What to do with Bunny over Christmas?

As summer approaches, many of us may be planning a getaway with friends and family. If you find yourself looking to board bunny during this time, some things you may want to consider are where your rabbit will be housed, temperature control and if there is adequate

protection from mosquitos and predators. There are very few rabbit specific boarding places and these are usually booked out very early - however you may find that some cat boarding facilities and vets may also take rabbits. Just make sure to ask about their previous experience with rabbits and even make a visit beforehand to inspect the space. We are looking to post more information on the website soon to help rabbit owners, with a question sheet to take to your local boarding residence. Watch this space.

Volunteer Drive

We're making a call out to any volunteers, friends or family members looking to bring some Christmas cheer to the bunnies over December and January. RRO must operate 365 days per year (the buns don't take holidays!) and as such we're looking for additional volunteers that can help over this holiday period, to ensure we have at least 2-3 people on site for cleaning duties every morning, and someone to help with medications and dinner duties in the afternoons and early evenings.

This month we feature RRO's Volunteer Coordinator Emma Kieryczuk.

How did you first hear about RRO?

It was about 2-3 years ago when I first heard about RRO. I used to work at an animal shelter that would transfer 'hard to rehome' rabbits and we used to recommend people wanting to adopt rabbits, to RRO.

How long have you been a volunteer at the orphanage?

I have been volunteering for nearly 7 months now.

What has been keeping you busy as a volunteer coordinator?

Updating the volunteer database, as well as recruiting new volunteers, and implementing new changes to the volunteer role.

What do you find most rewarding about

volunteering at RRO?

Helping the rabbits, and seeing the transformation they make, from when they first come in, to when they get adopted, and seeing them bonded with another rabbit, and going home to their new families.

What challenges have you faced in the role?


