Gentle Giants

Giant bunnies make the most fabulous loving pets. Weighing up to 6kg and some as big as cats they also make a great cuddle. Often the bigger the bunny, the better their temperament. My personal favourite but they are frequently overlooked in favour of the smaller breeds.

Giants need a good run space, and capacity to roam free indoors whilst supervised. They generally love a pat and a cuddle and some are real lap bunnies. Agouti giants like Lady (pictured top right) are often very hardy in terms of health also.

RRO currently has a selection of beautiful big bunnies including lovely Lady, Audie, and Alice. Looking for a baby giant? Both Alice and Lady have babies which also need rehoming.

We are hearing widespread reports of both calici-virus and myxomatosis Victoria wide. Both are carried and spread by mosquitos and both are mostly fatal. Whilst we are still fighting for the myxo vaccine here in Australia, there is an available vaccine for calici virus.

This needs to be given every 10 months to keep your bun safe. Please keep vaccinations up to date and keep your bunnies inside, particularly at dawn and dusk.
