As a result, this has meant a lack of responsibility by local councils or state governments for dumped pets which end up in shelters and in some cases have forced euthanasia due to high numbers of unwanted pets. 

#### **ALERT!** Foxes in Melbourne

A warning to our local Melbourne readers, there have been many reports of urban foxes spotted right across our metropolitan district. Foxes can set up comfortable dens in suburban areas as there are plenty of places to find good shelter and access to food.

Unfortunately rabbits are one of those food sources, so we urge any rabbit owners that may be keeping their buns outside currently, to bring them inside in the interest of their safety and longevity. It is also well known that bunnies thrive indoors - with an increased sense of safety and more social interaction, you will get to see their little personalities flourish.

## An Update From The Rabbit Doctors

Rabbits have a very delicate skeletal system compared to mammals. compared to a cat of similar

size, a cat's skeleton makes up about 13% of their bodyweight, whereas a rabbit's only makes up 8%. This is a substantial difference!

Combined with the powerful muscles of the rabbit, especially when kicking out, this makes them a lot more susceptible to injuries such as fractures if they are handled incorrectly.

This is why we need mature, knowledgeable homes for our rabbits, and supervision when interacting with children.

If you would like a refresher on rabbit handling and anatomy, have a chat to your bunny friendly vet.
