Storm in the Dandenong Rangers



The storm hit on a cold blustery night leaving the majority of residents in the Dandenong Ranges without power or services. We shivered without power or services and continued to care for the animals by torchlight. By day three, we purchased a generator to power the necessities, the fridge and some lights. Our only heating was the gas top on our stove. Our more fragile buns were taken into our house, which maintained more warmth

than the ice box that was the Orphanage. We worried about the buns with a level of underlying stress constantly present.

But many were more badly affected, with their homes destroyed in the storms. Large logs blocked the roads and many people were trapped in their properties waiting for emergency services. The devastation across the region was unimaginable and

unprecedented. We waited day after day, knowing that it would take time as emergency services worked around the clock to address the emergency. We had a visit from the red Cross and Defence Force, giving us confidence and advice. It was good to see that they were checking on everyone. Emergency sites were set up on ovals and parks for logs to be stored and mulching and other services to take place. There are support on roadside for residents, where they can get a hot meal or coffee and support. The main roads became work sites as emergency services work to move the debris and restore the power lines. It was very dangerous to drive in the hills with lines strewing the roadside. We spoke to Lee Ann, a teacher by profession, about her challenges since COVID.




conditioned bunny room."

Little Cuddles does not have mobility in one of her

back legs. A special customised mobility cart, by K9 Carts, was donated by a wonderful couple interstate, after they found that their little bunny benefited greatly from a similar cart. K9 Carts are more commonly known for their carts for challenged mobility for dogs. Cuddles is healthy and happy and the cart helps her to stand and move around, as she can push the cart with her good leg. Her

injury was from being dropped by a small human, which resulted in an injury to her lower spine.

She lives permanently in our home with her bunny friend Matty. Cuddles and Matty are featured in a video in our latest Gofundme.
